

Safely, Easily Vote at Home on Full, Verifiable Ballot

ATLANTA GA - **VoterGA** urges that **all Georgians vote from the comfort of their own homes** to alleviate health concerns, protect ballot privacy and cast their ballots on a verifiable, auditable, recount capable ballot.

Any registered voter can get a mail-in ballot application for an election from their county registrars or by downloading it from the Secretary of State web site:

Once the application is completed it can be scanned and returned to most counties via Email. The county will send voters a full ballot, not a barely legible selection summary. Once completed, voters can mail or deliver their ballots to a county office. Voters may also deliver it to an early voting location in some counties. Voters **cannot** turn in a mail-in ballot at the precinct on Election Day but can have a poll manager spoil it, and vote electronically there. Voters also **cannot** turn in others' mail-in ballots unless they previously checked the disabled box on their application.

Voters can further confirm that their ballots were received and counted as follows:

- Go to the [My Voter Page](#) at the Secretary of State web site;
- Submit your last name, first initial, county and birth date in the login box;
- Click on the Absentee Ballot Status link.

Voters can also download a mail-in ballot at the My Voter Page by clicking the absentee ballot portal link. We do not recommend entering your personal data into the portal though since it developed by a third-party vendor and may not be secure.
