

Dominion Memory Card Creation



In Person Voting

Mail-in Voting



Memory cards contain inperson ballot images, cast vote records and audit logs

These election records are created automatically when ballots are scanned in order to tabulate votes

Election Record Retention Law



Memory cards contain the most important election records other than the physical ballots because they can be used to reproduce the election results

Federal law: 22 Months - <u>USC 52 20701</u>

"Every officer of election shall retain and preserve, for a period of twenty-two months... all records and papers which come into his possession relating to any application, registration, payment of poll tax, or other act requisite to voting in such election,..."

State law: **24 Months** - <u>0.C.G.A. 21-2-73</u>

"All primary and election documents on file in the office of the election superintendent of each county, municipal governing authority, superintendent, registrar, committee of a political party or body, or other officer shall be preserved therein for a period of at least 24 months and then the same may be destroyed unless otherwise provided by law."

SEB Storage of Return Rule (for memory cards)



Current SEB Rule 183-1-12-.13:

"...the election superintendent may use the memory cards for programming ballot scanner units for the next primary, election or runoff."

A runoff can be only 60 days later

Proposed SEB Rule 183-1-12-.13:

"...the election superintendent shall retain the memory cards for a period of 24 months in accordance with Georgia law."

Minor Additional Changes

Diversions



SB202 made ballot images public record in 2021 but that is irrelevant because election records have <u>always</u> had a two year retention period

Memory cards <u>only</u> cost about \$10 each depending on storage capacity and can be purchased as Commercial Off the Shelf products from 3rd parties

By contrast our voting system cost:

- \$107+ million initial purchase
- \$10+ million total per year burden on counties for:
 - Maintenance, testing, certification, licensing, storage, logistics
- \$35 million in taxpayer funded interest
- Committed without required fiscal notes for purchase or ongoing expenses
- Financed by a 20 year bond for a system with a 10 year shelf life

Original Ballot Images for the November 2020 election


Of those, **36 Counties** are missing <u>100%</u> of their Original Ballot Images

5,026,684 Total cast ballots from Secretary of State


3,300,033 Original Ballot Images received by Voter GA



6 Counties Had No Recount or Original Images




Failure to retain Ballot Images that were automatically created by the voting system for tabulation

- 1. No original time stamp for audit purposes
- 2. No original meta data to show how ballot selections were interpreted
- 3. Images could have been replaced by tampering between scans





Requested Relief



Make SEB Rule 183-1-12-.13 conform to federal and state law by implementing proposed rule change to retain memory cards for 2 years

Issue a letter of instruction to Michael Barnes to prevent any further inappropriate advice to counties advocating destruction of election records

Issue SEB request to Superior Court judges in counties that could not produce memory card content asking courts to release corresponding ballots that are no longer under two year seal if they have not been destroyed
